

FUND UPDATE FOR YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2017

This fund update was first made publicly available on 30 June 2017.

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF THIS UPDATE?

This document tells you how the Koinonia KiwiSaver Scheme Growth Fund (the “Fund”) has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the Fund with other funds. The New Zealand Anglican Church Pension Board prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013.

This information is not audited and may be updated.

DESCRIPTION OF THIS FUND

The Fund invests mainly in growth assets such as equities and alternative assets. It has a small exposure to fixed interest, mortgages and cash. It is designed to have a medium to high risk profile and to appeal to investors with a long term investment horizon.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS OF INVESTING?

Risk indicator for the Fund:



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the Fund’s assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

Note that even the lowest category does not mean a risk-free investment, and there are other risks that are not captured by this rating.



HOW HAS THE FUND PERFORMED?

Annual Return Graph



This shows the return after fund charges and tax for each year ending 31 March since the fund started. The last bar shows the average annual return since the fund started, up to 31 March 2017.

Returns in this update are after tax at the highest prescribed investor rate (PIR) of tax for an individual New Zealand resident. Your tax may be lower.

WHAT FEES ARE INVESTORS CHARGED?

Investors in the Fund are charged fund charges. In the year to 31 March 2017 these were:

There are currently no transaction individual action fees (e.g. establishment, contribution, withdrawal, fund switching) or other fees charged.

From 1 April 2017 investors in the Fund are charged a fixed fee² of 1.6% p.a. of the net asset value of their monies invested in the Fund. The total annual fund charges are calculated daily as a percentage of the net asset value of the Fund.

Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.


EXAMPLE OF HOW THIS APPLIES TO AN INVESTOR

Rachel had \$10,000 in the Fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Rachel received a return after fund charges and tax were deducted of \$1,020.44 (that's 10.20% of her initial \$10,000). Rachel did not pay any other charges. This gives Rachel a total return after tax of \$1,020.44 for the year.

Currency Hedging

Currency exposures are monitored, and adjusted as appropriate, on a weekly basis. Accordingly, the Fund will not maintain the same level of currency hedging at all times. The currency risk benchmarks and ranges for the extent to which various asset classes are hedged to the New Zealand dollar are as follows:

- Cash and cash equivalents in any sector: 100% hedged to the New Zealand dollar;
- International fixed interest sector: 100% hedged to the New Zealand dollar;
- International equities sector: 50% hedged to the New Zealand dollar with a range of 25% to 75%; and
- Alternative assets (overseas) sector: 50% hedged to the New Zealand dollar with a range of 25% to 75%.

NOTES

- 1 Fund charges are the recovery of our actual expenses and costs for trusteeship, administration and investment management from Fund assets. We were also recovering establishment costs over time. From 1 April 2017 the Fund charge is fixed at 1.6% of the net asset value invested in the Fund.
2. In addition to the above fixed fee the Manager is entitled under the trust deed to be reimbursed from the Koinonia KiwiSaver Scheme for other costs and expenses, such as those that are irregular or extraordinary or cannot be reasonably known or estimated.
